



### From the Pastor . . .

We are off and running with our three-part sermon series on Jesus' story known as the "Parable of the Prodigal Son." Each sermon will focus on one of the three main characters in the parable. Last week, we named the story, "The Parable of the Loving Father," and examined how the actions of the loving father reflected the love of God. We noted that God consistently loves us, seeks to be in relationship with us, is willing to forgive us and wants us to live with a fullness of joy. The love of the father is the foundation upon which the stories of the two sons rest upon. In the same way, the love of God is the foundation upon which the stories of our individual lives rest upon.

In the "Parable of the Prodigal Son," we see the younger son intentionally spurn the love of his father and leave the protection of his home. He wants to make his own way in the world apart from his father. Sadly, this ancient story mirrors our own journeys as well. Sometimes, like the younger son, we make dramatic departures from God's love through conscious rebellion, but more often we drift away gradually, almost imperceptibly. Our priorities shift. Something else takes center stage - our careers, our achievements, our families, our pursuit of approval from others. We replace our relationship with the Father with countless other distractions, and before we realize it, we've wandered far from home. Sin has a way of clouding our perspective until we find ourselves spiritually bankrupt, surrounded by pigs, wondering how we got here.

Thankfully, the story doesn't stop with the younger son's destitute situation. The young man "comes to his senses" and heads home. Recognizing his mistakes, the son doesn't expect restoration with the father, only the grace to become a servant. Much to his surprise, the father meets him while he is still far off, running down the road with arms wide open. This, too, is the story of faith. God, through Jesus Christ, offers us an unconditional welcome back into the family of God. Ultimately, this part of the parable is less about leaving and more about returning. Wherever you find yourself at this point of your faith journey, remember, God is already running to meet you.
