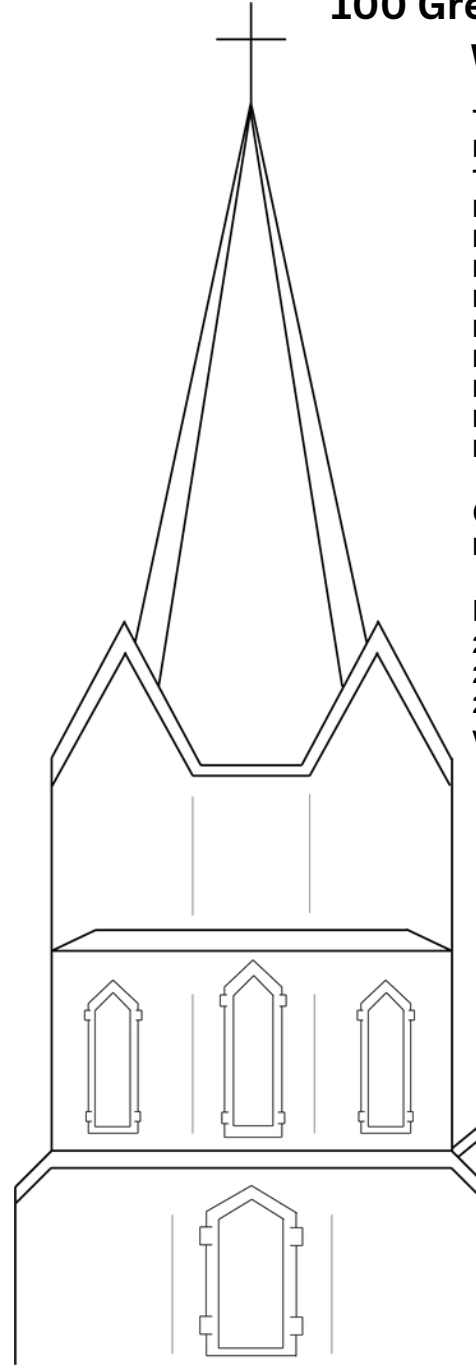

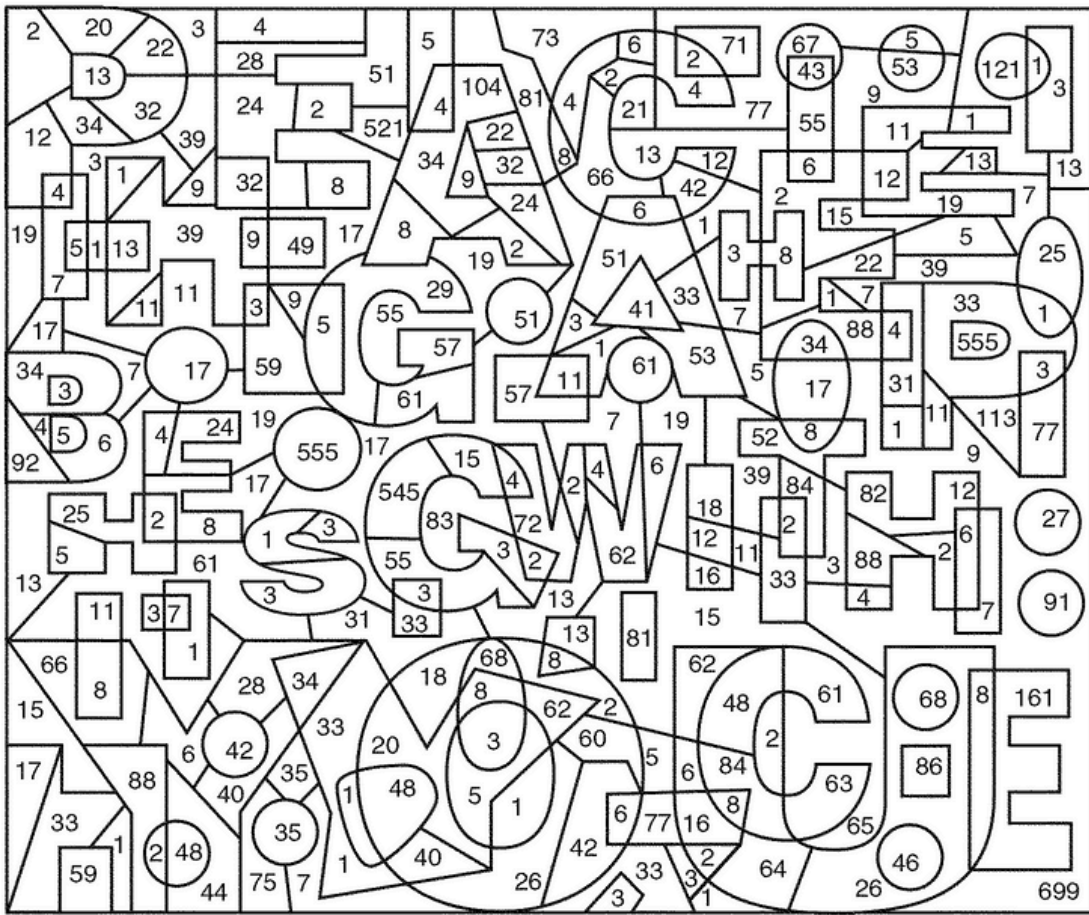

From the Pastor . . .

Easter is a great and grand celebration of God’s power. The crucifixion could not kill Jesus’ message. The grave could not contain him. Death could not hold him. In the resurrection of Jesus, we see the unbridle power of God working for good in the world. Despite being with Jesus throughout his public ministry, the disciples and followers of Jesus were largely perplexed by the empty tomb. Certainly, it defied all logic and ran counter to all natural processes. As the news seeped into their consciousness, the disciples came to believe that Jesus was, in fact, raised from the dead.

Despite the joy they felt knowing that their teacher, Savior and friend was alive again, their situation hadn’t changed. The antagonism of the Jewish leaders and Roman authorities did not dissipate following the crucifixion. The disciples remained worried whether they would face the same fate as Jesus. It’s not surprising that Jesus finds them behind locked doors both on Easter evening and the following week (John 20:19-29).

I’m sure we all can relate to the disciples’ situation. We live in the light of the resurrection. We believe in God’s power to transform our lives and our circumstance. Yet, we still face trials and difficulties. The storms of life still assail us. We still worry about today and tomorrow. This Sunday, we will look at John 20:19-29. Rather than center on Thomas’ response to the resurrection, we will focus on Jesus. Jesus comes to the disciples in the midst of their fears and concerns. He comes to bring them peace. It is a peace that doesn’t change their situation, but it promises to change them in their situation. The sermon will focus on the nature of the peace Jesus brings, not only to the disciples but to all believers. It’s a gift that is available to us.
